BRAD MEULI, PRESIDENT/CEO

Brad Meuli was named President/CEO of the Denver Rescue Mission in January 2001. Brad joined the Mission almost eight years ago as Senior Vice-President after a 17-year career in banking. Previous to his staff position at the Mission Brad served as Chairman of the Board of Directors.

Currently, as President and CEO, Brad oversees the operations of the Denver Rescue Mission, the oldest full service Christian charity in the Rocky Mountain region. The Mission has a yearly budget of over \$20 million, with approximately 150 employees. Founded in 1892, the Denver Rescue Mission is a Colorado non-profit organization that provides food, clothing, shelter, medical care, education, rehabilitation, and transitional housing to the poor and homeless.

Brad became a licensed minister in April 2000 through New Life in Christ Church and graduated with a MA in Leadership from Denver Seminary in May of 2006. As a leader, Brad's vision is to see the work of the Mission grow to match the needs of the poor and homeless: "Our biggest challenge at the Mission is to continue meeting the growing needs of the homeless in the Denver area. There continue to be more and more people who need our help."

Brad graduated from Northern Arizona University with a BS in Business and is a graduate of the Southwestern Graduate School of Banking at Southern Methodist University. He is a former Major in the U.S. Marine Corps.

As an active member of the Denver community, Brad is currently on the Board of Trustees of Bonfils Blood Center, having previously served as President. He is an alumnus of Leadership Denver and serves on the Board of Asian Hope, an orphanage in Cambodia.

Colorado Christian University recently honored Brad with an Honorary Doctorate for his work with the homeless. Brad is married, has five children and two grandchildren.
