# FACT SHEET:

## Four Core Strategies & 2019 Impact

### EMERGENCY SERVICES

- 773,717 Meals provided
- 415,091 Nights of shelter provided
- 38,198 Chapel attendance
- 10,392 People served at the Lawrence Street Community Center

### REHABILITATION

- 132 New Life Program participants paired with mentors
- 155 Participants got employed
- 102 New Life Program graduates
- After one year of program completion, 86% of graduates maintained their housing.

### TRANSITIONAL PROGRAMS

- 273 STAR households provided with safe shelter and life skills
- 94 Family Rescue Ministry households moved into permanent housing
- 47 Refugee households matched with mentors
- 32 STAR households moved into permanent housing
- 188 Children completed 3,369 hours of reading and writing homework
- After one year of program completion, 87% of STAR graduates maintained their housing.

### COMMUNITY OUTREACH

- 107,580 Pounds of food distributed
- 208 Tons of clothing distributed
- 1,965 Food boxes distributed at our Thanksgiving Banquet-in-a-Box event
- 16,481 Turkeys collected to feed people in need
- 92 Vehicles gifted
- 5,278 Pounds of diapers given to families in need

## OUR FOUR CORE STRATEGIES EXPLAINED

**Emergency Services** - People are invited inside, off the street where their immediate needs are met and critical relationships are built with Mission staff.

**Rehabilitation** - Men living with an addiction are equipped with work readiness skills, receive help to overcome destructive habits, find permanent housing, and begin a new life.

**Transitional Programs** - Families and individuals in need receive case management, develop life skills and save for permanent housing.

**Community Outreach** - People struggling in our community receive assistance with food, clothing, furniture, household items, and holiday meals.

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
